ISSUES OF PEACE AND JUSTICE

St. Paul reminds us today that we have the Spirit with us and that means we do not live ordinary lives in the world, but rather lives in constant relationship with God and others.

Jesus tells us that life in Him is not burdensome and stressful. And Catholic Social Teaching guides our Spirit-filled lives: *“Aware of the power of Christianity to renew even cultural and social realities the Church offers the contribution of her teaching to the building up of the human community by bringing out the social significance of the Gospel. At the end of the nineteenth century, the Church’s Magisterium systematically addressed the pressing social questions of the time, creating ‘a lasting paradigm for the Church. The Church, in fact, has something to say about specific human situations, individual, and communal, national and international. She formulates a genuine doctrine for these situations, a corpus which enables her to analyze social realities, to make judgments about them and to indicate directions to be taken for the just resolution of the problems involved.’ The intervention of Pope Leo XIII in the social and political reality of his time with the Encyclical Rerum Novarum ‘gave the Church ‘citizenship status’ as it were, amid the changing realities of public life, and this standing would be more fully confirmed later on”* (*Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church* by the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace, #521).

There will be one Saturday session in Reno. Our teacher, Gene Giuliano from the University of Dallas, will come to Reno on August 26, 2017, 9:30 AM-12:30 PM to introduce the program to participants and talk about the Bible from the Catholic perspective. (This session will be taped for participants who cannot make it that day.)

"This is a four-year program, and participants may attend any or all of the four years. The first two years of the CBS program focus on the biblical books that form the foundation of both the Old and New Testaments. Years Three and Four of the program cover the remaining books of the bible, emphasizing their contexts and principle themes. While starting at the beginning of the four-year cycle is encouraged, a student can join the program at any point."
